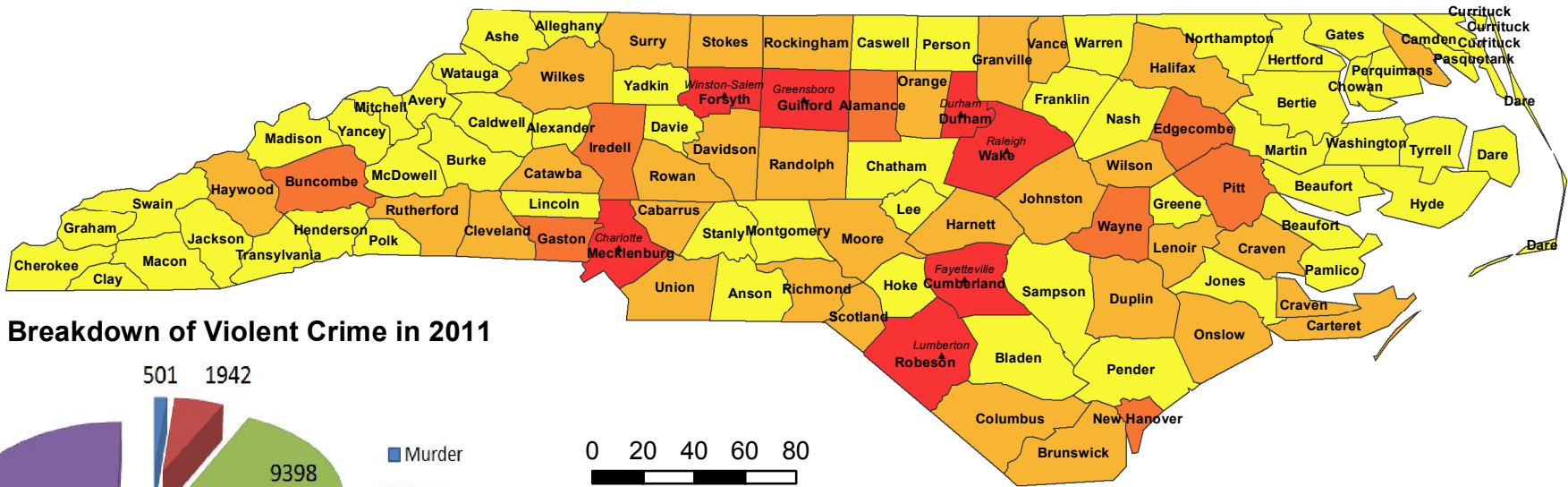
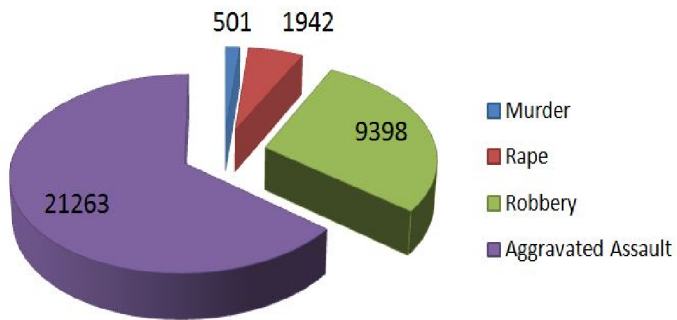


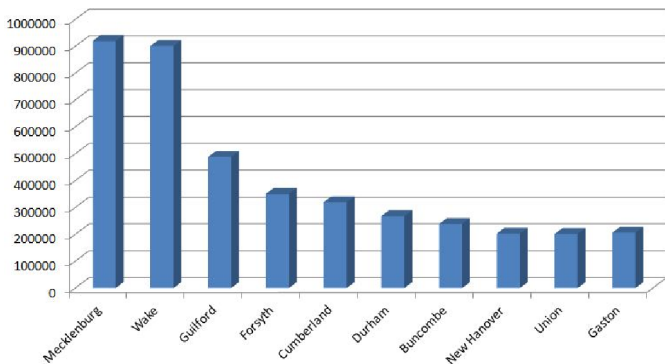
Violent Crime in North Carolina (2011)

What is Violent Crime?

According to North Carolina Uniform Crime Reporting data, violent crime is classified into four categories including murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. The map above represents the number of violent crime incidents that occurred in each county during the year 2011. Of the seven counties reporting more than 1,000 total violent crime incidents, six counties (Mecklenburg, Wake, Guilford, Forsyth, Cumberland, and Durham) are within the top ten most populated counties in North Carolina. This correlation helps to support the theory that violent crime is concentrated in areas with higher population densities.
